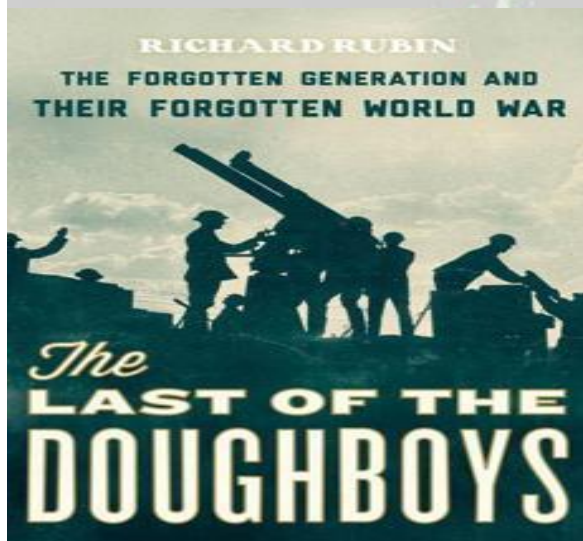

“THE LAST OF THE DOUGHBOYS” –
They were 19th Century Americans living in the 21st Century when nationally renowned author **Richard Rubin** traveled the country to meet and interview them: the very last living Americans who had been “Over There” in World War I. Based on his new book from Houghton Mifflin Harcourt, **Mr. Rubin** will present the fascinating story behind this monumental work of research and writing. 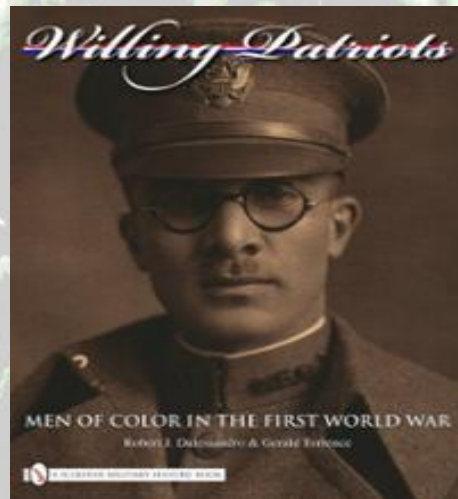
“The German Naval Mutinies of 1917-1919: Angry Sailors or Political Revolution?” – The well-known mutiny of the German High Seas Fleet in October 1918 is often credited with triggering the downfall of Wilhelm II’s government. Professional archivist and historian **Timothy Mulligan** uses new research to outline the full context of the October 1918 naval mutiny.





“The British Indian Army – A Strategic Perspective” – At the start of the war in 1914, the British Indian Army was the World’s largest volunteer army; its primary mission had been Imperial garrison duty and peace keeping. Dr. **Corey Reigel** of West Liberty University examines its role as an Allied strategic manpower reserve that evolved into the major weapon against the Ottoman Empire.

“Willing Patriots – Men of Color in the First World War” – Many are familiar with the exploits of the 369th Infantry, the “Harlem Hellfighters,” yet more than 350,000 African Americans served “Over There” during World War I. **Robert J. Dalessandro**, Executive Director of the US Army’s Center of Military History (CMH), tells the compelling story of African Americans in the AEF. His presentation is based on his book by the same title.



“A Fleet Second to None: The Naval Arms Race 1890s-1920s” - The naval arms race contributed to the causes and course of WW1, and even threatened to divide the victors in the peace which followed. UMBC history graduate and WFA East Coaster **Ryan Szimanski** will examine what effect the capital ship had on WW1’s causes, course, and aftermath.

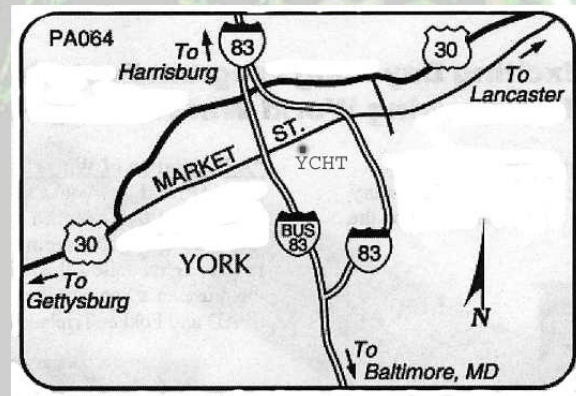
